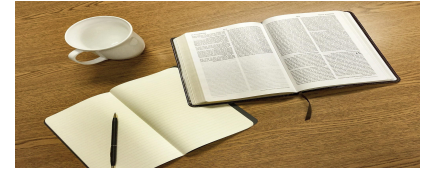

### **Recap of board minutes from April 21, 2026**

#### **Pastor Sandy's report:**

Eagle Scout Project – A young lady has selected our Peace Garden for her Eagle Scout project. A new Peace Pole has been ordered and will arrive soon. We should be hearing about her exact plans for the Peace Garden at the next board meeting. She would like to begin work this summer.

Brethren Disaster Ministries Sunday is May 3rd .

Burt and Helen Wolf will arrive at 9:00 A.M. and we will set up Brethren Hall tables and unload the supplies to assemble hygiene kits. The Wolf's will make a presentation during worship service describing BDM work and how far reaching these hygiene kits go throughout the world after disasters strike. Also, we will learn about other BDM efforts. After worship service we will assemble the kits. Last year we assembled over 600 kits. The kits contain washcloths, soap, toothbrush, toothpaste, comb and Band-Aids. This is a big service project for our church. Many hands will be needed.

Scout merit badge about military service.

Pastor Sandy and Lowell Hartman met with Scout leaders about this subject. The Scout leaders are also very much concerned, as they always try to promote peaceful alternatives. This merit badge has not been required as yet, and the Scouts and our church agree on this issue.

#### **Trustees report by Ed Petry:**

Thanks to a Scout leader who is a contractor, all three doors in Brethren Hall are scheduled to be replaced. All three doors are commercial steel doors. The work includes replacement of the hardware and trim. The cost is much less than other estimates that were gathered previously on our own.

Clean-up of church flower beds:

Ed is planning to contact the same young man as last year who worked to clean up the many flower beds around the church grounds. Lowell Hartman reported that a Scout workday will be Monday, April 27th . They will be cleaning up some overgrown shrubs and branches around the church property.

Sylvia Hess has introduced the idea of "A Day to Give Away." After seeing an article in the Messenger about how the Lafayette Church of the Brethren in Indiana held an event like this, she is proposing that we give it a try here at Beaver Creek COB. It is like a garage sale, only no cost at all for the items. It is a way to reach out to our community and help our neighbors with household items that we no longer have need for. Also, it would be an outreach to our neighborhood that we are a church that serves.

A planning meeting will be coming soon.

## **A Conversation with the Scouts Concerning New Merit Badge**

A concern from a member of the congregation was brought to the church's attention concerning a newspaper article in the Dayton Daily News about a new merit badge that would replace a current badge. This new badge, called *Military Service & Veterans Merit Badge* would replace one that is called *Citizenship in Society Merit Badge*. To address this concern a letter was drafted and sent to the scout leadership. A meeting was held in April with Lowell Hartman, Pastor Sandy, and two of the scout leaders to discuss and address concerns. Below is the initial letter from the church. The written information from the Scout leadership follows:

To: Scout Leadership

From:

Reverend Sandra Jenkins / Beaver Creek Church of the Brethren Church Board

Concerning: Military Service & Veterans Merit Badge

To all scout leadership,

It is our understanding that the *Military Service & Veterans Merit Badge* will replace the current *Citizenship in Society Merit Badge* (currently no longer available as of February 2026). We, of the Beaver Creek Church Brethren, our district, and denomination hold fast to our core belief that peaceful Godly service to all people is utmost. We take issue with the current federal administration's newly named Department of War (the Department of Defense) to pressure and impose Defense Secretary Pete Hegseth's "key reforms" on our youth, especially as the department does not take into account military service alternatives that focus on peace practice humanitarianism (. . . after previous concerns regarding diversity, equity and inclusion (DEI), religion, and "cultural changes" that included combining Boy and Girl Scouts).[1]

The Church of the Brethren being one of the three peace churches (which includes the Quakers and Mennonites), will not participate or have our name associated with the education and/or activities that will further an ethos of the current administration or anything that goes against our core beliefs:

*The Church of the Brethren regards with sorrow and deep concern our nation's increasing movement toward a permanently militaristic outlook. Two devastating world wars, the conflict in Korea, the Vietnam War, and the many international crises of recent decades have produced an alarming change in American attitudes toward war and peace. The American public may come to accept as normal and inevitable the prospect that the nation must be prepared to go to war at any moment, that every young man and woman must spend time in military service, that an overwhelming share of our Federal taxes must be devoted to military needs, and that this country must always be willing to assume the military burdens of weaker allies, actual or potential. Because of our complete dissent from these assumptions, the Church of the Brethren desires again, as at other times in its history, to declare its convictions about war and peace, military service and conscription, the use of tax money for military purposes, the right of Christian conscience, and the responsibility of Christian citizenship.[2]*

The official position of the Church of the Brethren is that all war is sin and that we seek the right of conscientious objection to all war. While the decision to join the military is personal to each individual, the education of such choice must be coupled with peaceful alternatives to military service. We understand that an individual may choose a military path. We, of course, continue to hold all of our active military, their families, and veterans in constant prayer and grace.

With this stated and to address our concern, should the scout leadership plan to promote this new merit badge as defined by the current federal administration's ethos, we respectfully direct that all education and activities required for this merit badge be done off church property. The presentation of this merit badge to a scout must be done off church property as well. We as a church, appreciating the treasured partnership we have with the scouts, continue to encourage the scout leadership to include educating their youth on the alternatives to military service and peaceful ways of humanitarian service to others.

**written response of the Scout leadership:**

Thank you for your letter, and I will be sure to share it with the rest of the committee. We absolutely understand your position and the concerns that you have expressed in the letter, and take these concerns seriously. We are more than happy to discuss these with you in early April.

Before we meet, I did want to make a clarification to the statement "...Military Service & Veterans Merit Badge that replaces the current Citizenship in Society Merit Badge." Scouting America has executed 2 separate, but related, actions:

1) Scouting America discontinued the Citizenship in Society merit badge, reducing the Eagle-required merit badges from 14 to 13 merit badges. The scouts still have to earn 21 total merit badges to qualify for Eagle Scout, with one additional elective merit badge added to reach 21 total.

2) Scouting America introduced a Military Service & Veterans badge, which is currently in a test phase. In October 2026, votes will be tallied from scouts voting for or against this becoming a full merit badge, and scouts can also suggest changes to make the merit badge more engaging. If this badge does transition into becoming a full merit badge, it will be an elective, optional merit badge (similar to the 200+ other merit badges in scouting) and will NOT be required for Eagle Scout.

I hope this clarifies the actions Scouting America has taken -- this new Military Service & Veterans badge, should it be approved as a merit badge, will not replace the Citizenship in Society merit badge as a mandatory requirement for Eagle Scout.

Thank you again for taking the time to write this letter, and please let us know if you have any questions.

### **The results of our interactions and communication:**

Our relationship with the scouts and their leadership is utmost important and the in-person conversation concerning this was fruitful and educational for all of us. As we stand by our convictions and seek God in all peaceful conversations, may we continue to be respectful with each other now and into the future.



### **Amish Butter Cookies**

Only 4 ingredients! No mixer required!

2 ¼ cups whole wheat flour

¼ cup sugar

14 tablespoons cold unsalted butter (leave out 30 minutes to soften slightly)

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

Mix everything together with your hands in a bowl. Move onto the counter and knead until smooth.

Take a tablespoon sized portion and roll into a ball. Flatten slightly.

Roll one side in sugar and press gently.

Place on a baking sheet, lined with parchment paper.

For a pretty pattern on top, use a glass and indent the dough slightly on the tops about

5 times.

You will get about 18 cookies.

Bake in preheated oven at 355 degrees for 12 to 14 minutes until edges turn golden brown.

Cool completely on the tray before removing. They will be soft inside and lightly crisp on the outside.
